- ★ On warm days, snakes may be out. If you see a snake "stand still". Snakes will get scared if we shout and throw things at them. By standing still they will move on.
- ★ Keep to tracks and trails in bushland areas
- ★ Don't touch or feed wildlife (but we can touch, feel and smell them)
- ★ Don't pick flowers or plants
- ★ Put all rubbish in the bin
- ★ This also protects us in the bush too. 'Minimal impact' means that we don't damage the environment or harm animals and their habitat.

THE PAVILION AND AMPHITHEATRE

Plenty of space to run and do track and field training.

Bursaria spinosa, native Blackthorn, is an important spiky shrub species in this area. It attracts native butterflies and provides shelter for small birds.

PIMELEA LOOP

An easy grade path that takes you past the magical water hole of Grey Box Gum Dam, up to Hilltop Lookout with views over Sydney and down to Lizard Log playground. The path is wheelchair accessible. Bring a picnic, scooter or bikes and explore the trails beyond Pimelea Loop.



HILLTOP LOOKOUT

Can you climb the hill? It's worth it. At the top there is a great view. Kids have planted a lot of native plants up here. How are their plantings growing?

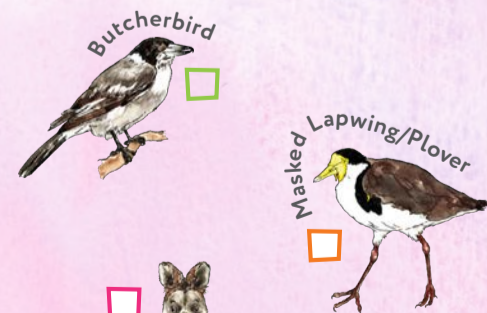
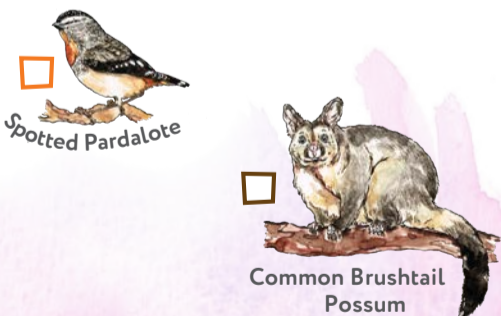
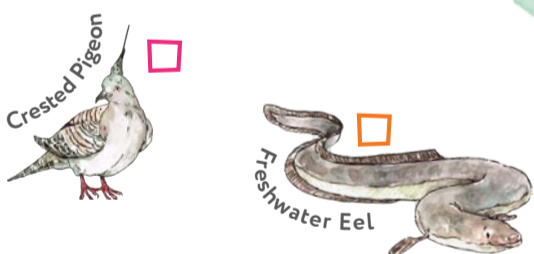

- ★ Eastern Long-necked Turtle
- ★ Freshwater Eel
- ★ Purple Swampphen

DID YOU KNOW... Tiny creatures called macroinvertebrates live in the dam. We can tell how clean the water is by which creatures are present.
